## BUSINESS

- **Chairman's Report:** Regarding the design concepts for the Garden Trail (*see October*), Rich has asked to make a presentation at a Woman's Club meeting.

At the November 7<sup>th</sup> Synott's Pond work party, 8 tons of stone was laid in Breakback Run and bushes were planted at the Elm Street entrance.

Bob has researched costs of getting a long-reach excavator under this year's budget: \$1,150/day rental plus other expenses would total approximately \$4,500. Regarding the boat idea (*see October*), Mr. Kaeferle mentioned that the borough is disposing of a fire boat; Scott Birkland will see if it might be useful.

Dave is 2/3rds of the way through the Recreational Trails Program grant request. A state permit is required, but it will not be difficult to obtain. The proposal is really an entire trail upgrade, not just a single bridge replacement.

The Shawnee Drive erosion problem may not be on borough land; we need to find out.

The conservation sign near the Mantua Creek Trail which was damaged in an accident is being replaced at a cost of \$150 from the borough budget.

The balance in Friends of Wenonah Trails is \$8,439.07.

The first 2010 Vulture Festival organization meeting was held on November 10<sup>th</sup>. Program elements are planned to include live animals, Native American storytellers, "Dancing with Vultures," a humorous vulture skit, and singer-songwriter Jim Six.

\$257 will be billed to Mr. Pritchard for stone placed at Synnott's Pond.

- **Liaison (Scott Birkland):** Tommy Lombardo and Chris Newman will help to remove the Comey's Lake fountain for the winter.
- **Public Comment (Phil Kaerle):** Stone and other materials are free for the taking at the Public Works yard due to upcoming paving.

The borough will pursue a draining permit for Wenonah Lake to occur in the March timeframe in order to remove debris from the dam area. As always, assistance will be needed to collect wayward fish.
